I usually have students work with a partner to generate a list of things that move fast and slow. Then the students share their ideas with the whole class. I encourage the kids to try to think of the most original ideas.

Comparing Speeds

p. 8

This is a math activity. Students find out how fast animals can move and order them from slowest to fastest.


As a warm-up with older kids, I have them try to guess the speeds first before they see the worksheet.

Favourite Vehicles p. 9

This activity is an opportunity for students to think about their own preferences and to practice ranking items. Students draw pictures of their favourite vehicles, write the name of the vehicle and then present their list to the class or to a friend.

Design a Vehicle p. 10

This is a creative activity that allows students to think about how vehicles move. After making an advertisement for their new vehicle, students can also make 3D models out of scrap materials.





COMPARING SPEEDS

Dolphins can swim 25 miles/hour. Horses can run 35 miles/hour.






Cows can run 8 miles/hour.

Elephants Can run 10 miles/hour.




T-rex dinosaurs could run 20 miles/hour.
